

STRATHPINE GYMPIE ROAD STREET-SCAPING UPGRADE

SEPTEMBER 2021

Moreton Bay Regional Council (Council) is progressing the design of footpath upgrade works along Gympie Road in Strathpine.

Why do we need to upgrade footpaths along Gympie Road?

Council supports a healthy and active lifestyle for residents by investing in safe, efficient, reliable and integrated traffic and pedestrian networks.

The aim of this project is to improve public safety and accessibility by:

- Renewing footpaths
- Replacing street furniture
- Upgrading driveway surfacing
- Refurbishing street number markers
- Installing new pavements that promote water filtration to the soil below, improving moisture retention for the iconic gateway Hoop Pine trees

When will contruction work begin?

The full concept plan for the street-scaping project is yet to be finalised. It will be shared on the project website as soon as it's available.

Construction work is expected to be completed by mid 2022.

Council wants to ensure we minimise the impact of construction work on stakeholders particularly local businesses.

For this reason, we are planning for some construction work to be completed at night and outside of peak business hours, subject to approval by the Department of Transport and Main Roads.

Where are the upgrades taking place?

Council is focusing on upgrades to footpaths from 314 Gympie Road (opposite Learmonth Street) up to and including 400 Gympie Road (property to the north and adjacent to Hungry Jacks) in Strathpine.







What about the gateway Hoop Pines?

The Hoop Pines (*Araucaria cunninghamii*) along Gympie Road verges are iconic features of the area. Council is committed to long term preservation of the Hoop Pines and they will be protected during the construction period.

What can we expect to see during construction?

Things will look slightly different along Gympie Road while construction work is underway in the first half of 2022. You may see:

- Temporary footpaths providing alternative access to businesses
- Temporary re-directional signage
- Construction site fencing
- Construction machinery on site which may be noisy at times

Council's aim is to undertake potentially high impact works outside of normal business hours where possible.

Consulting with our community

Consultation on the Gympie Road Street-Scaping Upgrade will be open until 11 October 2021. It's important that we understand how construction work may impact you.

Council will consider your feedback to try to minimise inconvenience during construction.
