Introduction

Caboolture West is Moreton Bay Regional Council's ('Council') single largest growth front and is expected to accommodate approximately 70,000 residents over the next 40 years.

The name Caboolture West is an administrative name that refers to a local plan area within Council's Planning Scheme. It is not a gazetted place name. With this new development and community now emerging, it is timely to explore and establish new names for the whole area and suburbs within it; names that reflect and resonate with both the existing and future communities.

The Caboolture West Name Your Place Survey is part of a larger project that aims to establish place identity and names that support the development of liveable and desirable communities within Caboolture West and respect the social, cultural and environmental values of the existing and the potential future communities.

Names matter, identity matters, community voices matter. This is not only about establishing an identity for the new residents that will come but to help existing communities develop a sense of connection with these new areas and alter the trajectory of their own communities. This project provided a genuine opportunity to bring community voices into the process of determining the new names for the area and suburbs within it.



Methodology

The survey design

Voconiq collaborated closely with Council to develop the Name Your Place Survey tool. The survey was deliberately designed to be short and use plain language. The main focus of the survey was to collect name suggestions from the community with some additional questions about community values and demographics. The survey instrument can be found in Appendix 1.

First, the survey introduced participants to the anticipated development of Caboolture West and described the purpose of the survey. A map of the region supported the introduction (Appendix 1). Before continuing to the actual questions, participants needed to provide informed consent. Anyone under the age of 18 needed their parent/guardian to consent to participate. There was also an additional layer of protection for participants under the age of 15 by removing questions asking for name and contact details and irrelevant questions, such as asking for employment status.

Next, participants were asked to complete a series of questions relating to four key topic areas (Table 1).




Figure 1. An example of the maps that were used in the survey. (Legend: West local plan

Where participants were invited to provide name suggestions, different maps were used to visualise the areas being named: the whole area (new city) and potential future suburbs within it (see Figure 1 for an example and Appendix 1 for all maps). To guide respondents

to make acceptable name suggestions, Council developed the Place Naming Criteria for the project. This criteria aligned with the State Government's Place Naming Principles. A link to criteria document was provided in this section (Appendix 2). This document explained that names should be meaningful, verifiable, unique, recognisable and enduring, whereas, they should not be offensive to any reasonable person, be commercial or otherwise protected. To make it easier for participants, a summary of the most critical points was included in the survey itself.

Participants were able to nominate which area/s they were naming and submit multiple names for different areas, asking them to consider names that are unique, not commercial or trademarked, and inoffensive. They could suggest names for area; A - G potential future suburb.) one or as many of the following as they wanted:

- whole Caboolture West local plan area (the new city) and potential future suburb E, which is anticipated to become the city centre and will adopt the same name given to the whole area
- specific potential future suburbs A, B, C, D, F or G
- any potential future suburb (where the name was not tied to a specific location but remained relevant to the general Caboolture West local plan area).

Finally, participants could opt-in to answer a few more questions about what characteristics they value most when they chose a place to live, or otherwise move on to the final demographic section of the survey.

Engaging with community

The Name Your Place Survey was open for community input between 10 August and 5 September 2021. Being inclusive was very important for the survey to gain a sample that represents the overall population of the region. The survey was made available online and in hard copy to minimise barriers to participation. Council actively promoted it via multiple channels to maximise awareness and encourage the participation of everyone who lives, works and plays in the region or has a strong connection to the Caboolture West area.

Some of the promotional tools and channels used by Council included:

- Online engagement hub: Council created a 'Caboolture West Place Naming' page on their Your Say Moreton Bay platform where information about the project and a link to the survey was made available (Appendix 5).
- Social media: Multiple posts and advertisements on Council's main Facebook and Moreton Says Facebook (Appendix 3).

- **Printed communication:** The survey was delivered to 5,500 properties within the Caboolture West local plan area (Appendix 4). Posters, flyers, hard copy surveys and digital displays were in Council's Customer Service Centres and libraries.
- Face to face: The survey was promoted in community focus groups run to help define community identity and inform suburb boundary definitions in and around Caboolture West. Council doorknocked 33 businesses in Caboolture West and neighbouring suburbs talking to business operators and distributing flyers and posters.
- **Newsletters and emails:** Information about the project was included in PD News Council's long running newsletter that services the development industry and interested community members that have subscribed, as well as Council's internal newsletter Connect MBRC. Emails were sent to those that registered their interest via the project's Your Say Moreton Bay page.
- Media releases and media interviews: Council made media releases and spokespeople participated in media interviews promoting the Caboolture West Place Naming Project.
- Councillor support: Hard copy surveys, posters and social media shareables were
 provided to local Councillors for their use in promoting the opportunity to be part of
 the project.
- **Third party support:** Information, surveys, social media shareables, a classroom activity kit and advertisements suitable for school newsletters were distributed to 18 local educational facilities that service the Caboolture West area.

Data analysis and list of name suggestions

Once the survey closed, a data cleaning process removed instances where the same person suggested the same name multiple times but allowed people to submit multiple different names at different points in time (i.e. if multiple people from the same household participated).

Next, a frequency distribution analysis was done for all multiple-choice, Likert-scale and ranking type questions to understand how often a specific answer was selected by the participants. Then, participants' name suggestions and the justifications for the suggested names were extracted into worksheets for an initial screening of all suggested names against the Place Naming Criteria (Appendix 2).

The names were classified into three categories:

- **Red:** Suggested name does not comply with the Place Naming Criteria, e.g. the name is offensive or honours a person that is still alive.
- Yellow: Suggested name seems to meet most of the criteria.
- **Green:** Suggested name seems to meet all the criteria and be meaningful for the area based on participant's justification.

The classification of names into the three categories is only a pre-screening that does not replace a thorough research and verification process of selected names before presenting them to the Place Naming Committee for shortlisting.

Who participated in the survey?

The Caboolture West Name Your Place Survey provided an opportunity to everyone who lives, works or plays in the region to submit their name suggestions. Participants were diverse and from all walks of life and the name suggestions reflect the diversity of the community itself.









Main findings

Importance of thematic aspects




Figure 2. Importance of thematic aspect when naming a place where communities live, work and play (higher scores represents higher importance) (N= 324).

When participants were asked to rank in order of importance six themes that can inspire place names it was revealed the local environment is of primary importance – approximately 40% of participants ranked it as most important to them (Figure 2). This was followed by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander heritage and culture, and local history. Aspirations for the future of the area was the least important.

Value statements and features for the future development of Caboolture West

When participants were asked to choose up to three features that would be most important for them in the future development of Caboolture West aside from housing diversity, traffic management and environmental protection that Moreton Bay Regional Council already understands as important issues, the following was revealed:




Figure 3. Importance of value statements for the future development of Caboolture West in percentage of how many participants selected it (the higher the percentage, the more important the value statement) (N=311).

"A sustainable centre surrounded by Glass House Mountain vistas, natural beauty and farmlands" is most important, closely followed by "Embracing natural features, such as the Caboolture River" (Figure 3). Both were selected by approximately 60% of all participants, whereas all other features were only selected by 31% or fewer participants.

Name suggestions




Figure 4. Map used in the survey to outline the whole Caboolture West area and the suburb E.

For the whole Caboolture West local plan area and potential future suburb E (Figure 4), 229 name suggestions were submitted. In the initial screening, we identified 36 suggested names that did not meet the *Place Naming Criteria*.




Figure 5. Map used in the survey to indicate the suburbs A-D and G-F.

Participants suggested 337 names for the other potential future suburbs (Figure 5, excludes future potential suburb E). In the initial screening, we found 52 did not meet the *Place Naming Criteria*.

Council will undertake more thorough assessment of the names against the Place Naming Criteria before the suggested names are taken to the Place Naming Committee.

Community values when choosing a place to live




Figure 6. Ratings of importance when choosing a place to live (higher scores represent higher importance) (N= 121).

When participants were asked to rate how important a range of characteristics were when choosing a place to live, the following was revealed: it is most important to participants how safe they feel in the region, closely followed by the natural beauty of the region (Figure 6). There was also strong agreement sustainable living with efficient housing, energy and resources as well as ease of affording the lifestyle people want are important values. Participants rated how close they are to cultural experiences (e.g., libraries, museums, and performing arts) as least important.

Summary


The planned development in Caboolture West aims to bring a host of business, employment, education and lifestyle opportunities, as well as a diverse housing options, and community and recreation experiences. The area has the potential to be the region's heartland of tomorrow. Council aims to rename the whole area (the new city) and the potential future suburbs within it to establish names that resonate with both the existing and future communities. The survey was implemented to provide community members with a "Name your Place" opportunity to propose name suggestions and provide insights about their values when choosing a place to live.

The survey instrument aimed to elicit appropriate and contextually relevant name suggestions with reference to the *Place Naming Criteria*. The survey was promoted by Council via multiple channels in online and paper versions to maximise participation of the target audience, community members of the Moreton Bay Region. 410 responses were collected in 30 days from a diverse demographic background. After data cleaning, a frequency analysis was conducted, and name suggestions and any accompanying justification extracted for review. All names were assessed against the *Place Naming Criteria* and classified into three different groups reflecting their potential to be used as a area and suburb names.

In total, 566 name suggestions were submitted – 229 for the whole area and 337 for the suburbs. After a first assessment, it seems that 476 of these names meet all or most of the *Place Naming Criteria* and 88 names are clearly not appropriate. The survey also provided insights about what themes community members rate as most important when naming a place. Participants indicated most often that names should be inspired by the local environment, followed by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander heritage and culture, and local history. Aspirations for the future of the area was the least important.

The survey also took advantage of the opportunity to test different value statements with the community regarding the future development of the region and, more generally, about choosing a place to live. For the future development of Caboolture West, participants most strongly favoured an area that has "A sustainable centre surrounded by Glass House Mountain vistas, natural beauty and farmlands", closely followed by "Embracing natural features, such as the Caboolture River". When choosing a place to live, the results revealed it is most important to participants how safe they feel in the region, closely followed by the natural beauty of the region, and sustainable living with efficient housing, energy and resources.



Place naming criteria

Caboolture West Place Naming

Place names should be:

Meaningful	Must be relevant to the local, historical (either Indigenous or non-Indigenous), cultural, geographical, environmental (flora, fauna) and/or physical (landscape) attributes of the place. Naming a place in honour of a person can only occur after the person has passed away and if that person does not have a criminal history. The person commemorated should have contributed significantly to the area (ownership of land in itself is not sufficient).
Verifiable	Claims of historical or cultural significance can be substantiated. If the name is of Indigenous origin it should be of the local language and endorsed by the Traditional Custodians.
Unique	Must not duplicate or be similar in spelling or sound to other locality names in Australia (e.g. 'Wytmont', 'Whitmont'). Check for possible name duplication using the Gazetteer of Australia.
Recognisable	Must be simple, concise and easy to read, pronounce and spell (using standard alphabet and Australian English spelling conventions as appropriate). Names should be no longer than 50 characters and preferably be one word. Avoid hyphenation, abbreviations, initials, acronyms, and prefixes or suffixes, such as 'Upper', 'New', 'East', 'West'. If the place name references a personal name, it should adopt the spelling of that name (e.g. 'MacRaes Flat' not 'McRaes Flat', where named after Mrs MacRae).
Enduring	It is likely to stand the test of time.

Place names must not be:

Offensive to any reasonable person	Must not discriminate, be demeaning or be likely to give offence in line with contemporary community standards and values.
Commercial	Must not advertise or promote commercial enterprises or be able to be interpreted as doing such. Must not breach trademark laws.
Protected	Must not be words or acronyms protected by State or Commonwealth legislation, without appropriate Ministerial approval.

The above criteria are consistent with the State Government's <u>Place Naming Principles</u>. These principles include additional guidelines for name structure, punctuation and use of alternative names that will also be adhered to by Council.






