Part 5 Local annoyances and hazards

- What are local annoyances and hazards—Authorising local law, s 16 (1)
 - (1) For section 16 (1)(e) of the authorising local law, the following are declared to be local annoyances and hazards—

- (e) shopping trolleys left in public places;
- Prescribed requirements for local annoyances and hazards—Authorising 9 local law, s 19(1)

For section 19(1) of the authorising local law, a responsible person for a local annoyance or hazard must meet the following prescribed requirements—

(5) **Shopping trolleys**

- Shopping trolleys must not be taken from a shopping centre precinct without the consent of the owner of that trolley, and left in a public place outside the shopping centre precinct; and
- The owner or occupier of a shopping centre which provides shopping trolleys for customer use must take all reasonable precautions to ensure that all shopping trolleys provided for customer use remain within the shopping centre precinct.

Example:

Fitting shopping trolleys with a wheel lock or a coin operated release.
