[00:00:01] Moreton Bay Regional Council are working on plans to upgrade the Deception Bay Skatepark, and we need your help to make sure the design is unique and caters to the local community.

[00:00:14] Before starting the design we held an online survey to ask the community what they would like the redeveloped facility to look like. And we had over 100 responses full of awesome feedback, which we've used to shape the design. Based on community feedback and our assessment of the existing skate parks conditions, it has been determined the existing skate park requires demolishing and replacing. This is due to many safety hazards, poor structural condition and an outdated design. We're planning to replace the existing facility with a contemporary skate park that meets the needs of current and future skate park users.

[00:00:52] The concept design is now at a stage where you can see what we came up with and tell us what you think. The design ties in with the PCYC, existing playground and amenities to create a district level skate facility that caters to skate park users of all ages and skill levels, as well as providing an inviting space for spectators and the wider community. The design comprises of three skate zones which cater to different user groups. A lot of you told us you want street obstacles.

[00:01:24] So the first sign comprises of a fourth foot flat bank hip, bank to curb stepped ledges set within a mallow bank, a central escalating curve fun box, bank to jersey barrier, the euro gap and then A frame with a rail and ledge. We know that the existing park users love transition, so we've taken that into consideration to create a fun open flow bowl, which targets beginner to intermediate users with some more advanced obstacles. We've included several quarter pipe hips, a tight taco pocket, an extension with pool coping and a six foot high steep bank extension. Emergency and maintenance access into the bowl is a requirement, which has taken into consideration by providing an open bowl.

[00:02:16] The open flow bowl links into a three foot open mini bowl, which is located in close proximity to the spectators zone.

[00:02:26] Finally, when you're done with writing a stating the park, we've included plenty of seating and a refuge zone to chill with a shade shelter and drinking fountain, we've also included footpaths so you can access seating areas and walk around the facility safely. Feedback is important to ensure the design best meets the needs of the local community. Make sure you provide your feedback in the online survey to let us know what you think.
