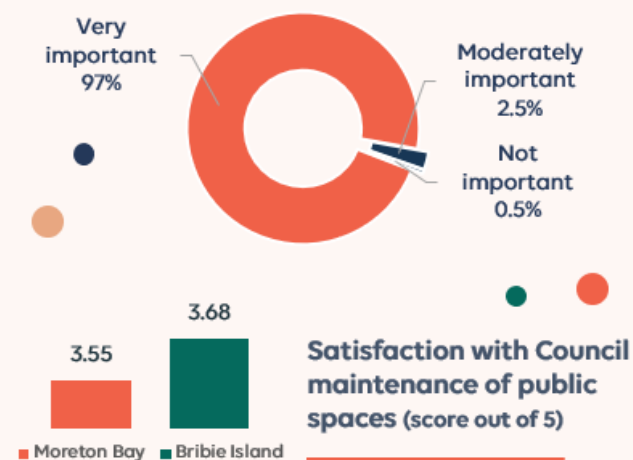


Top rated value

Bellara Foreshore (Sylvan Beach) Renewal Project

The Bellara foreshore precinct attracts locals and visitors alike with its open spaces, spectacular views to the Glass House Mountains, playgrounds and community facilities. Council is working with the Queensland Government to improve the Bellara foreshore precinct.

Planned improvements

The Bellara Foreshore (Sylvan Beach) Renewal Project will include:

- ✓ New and upgraded playgrounds, lighting, picnic areas and boardwalks
- ✓ More seating and shaded areas
- ✓ Better accessibility throughout the foreshore area
- ✓ Safer pedestrian access around roads and carparks
- ✓ New and upgraded toilet blocks
- ✓ New storage facilities for water sports groups
- ✓ A future event space with new facilities for markets and other activities.

The plan includes more trees and other native plants. We will protect existing vegetation as much as possible, but a few plants may be impacted by upgrades.

Upgrades to the Bellara foreshore precinct will be delivered in stages.

The Queensland Government has approved funding through the South East Queensland Community Stimulus Program (SEQCSP) to deliver the first stage of the Bellara foreshore (Sylvan Beach) renewal.
