# We've heard what you value Redcliffe Peninsula and Deception Bay.


Between 15 May and 16 June 2023 we asked the community to tell us about the built form and design they would most like to see taller buildings take.

Engagement activities included:


- An online survey about built form options



# Comments received about design themes



#### **Design theme: Attractive**

Key themes emerging from online and dropin sessions included preferences for:

- Open, airy, architectural designs
- Lower heights along the beachfront, with taller buildings behind
- Use of a variety of good quality materials, avoiding excess concrete
- Colours, materials and style that reflect and complement the local character
- Larger apartments with comfortable living spaces

### **Design theme: Liveable**

Key themes emerging from online and dropin sessions included preferences for:

- Avoiding shadows on the beach and neighbouring properties
- Ground floor businesses like cafes, restaurants and shops
- Fully accessible units
- Spaces that build community within and around buildings
- Space to allow sunlight and airflow between buildings

## Phase 1 consultation outcomes

Coastal Building Design Review

### **Design theme: Subtropical**

Key themes emerging from online and dropin sessions included preferences for:

- Retaining existing trees and wildlife habitat
- Adding more greenspaces
- Including trees and greenery in buildings - balcony or roof gardens
- Using subtropical trees and plants
- Sustainable buildings with rainwater collection, solar power and energy efficient design
- Considering sun and wind direction in building design to reduce impacts

We will be forming a Community Reference Group (CRG) made up of local residents who will help us better understand this feedback. The CRG will work with Council's planners and consultants to help further understand the Redcliffe Peninsula and Deception Bay community's values, and better understand issues and aspirations to inform future building design policies.
